
# Introduction

As a nationally recognised subject matter specialist, Andrew has advised the Home Office, Counter Terrorism Policing, SO15, the British Army, the Royal Air Force, the Education sector, HMPPS, HMCTS, many police forces and other government agencies, and has presented his work at New Scotland Yard and the Houses of Parliament.

This document is designed as an easy access guide for Heathen Kindreds to identify sources of extremism and radicalisation within the Pagan milieu; the lists are not definitive, and are designed to be taken in context with other potential indicators.





# The history of **Pagan** extremism in the UK

---

# The Imperial Fascist League 1929-1939

**Part of the early Fascist movement in the UK, and the first to explicitly link Norse Pagan iconography with extreme right-wing ideology.**

Arnold Leese, a self-proclaimed 'Odinist' did not simply import and adopt the swastika (*Fylfot*) as a signification of his undoubted admiration of, links to, and aspirations towards the Nazi party.

Almost ironically, Leese's interpretation of the swastika was perhaps more definitively founded in Germanic Paganism than that of Nazi Germany.

Leese's adoption and interpretation of the swastika was influenced by Henry Hamilton Beamish, the founder of the antisemitic publishing house The Britons Publishing Society: "For Beamish, the swastika was 'the White man's Cross' – a symbol of racial salvation as opposed to the Christian Cross, which because it 'includes negroes and all sorts of other people in its fold ... cannot help us'".

Another patron, Lieutenant-Colonel Lawrence Augustine Waddell, who wrote *The British Edda* and *The Phoenician Origins of Britons, Scots, and Anglo-Saxons*, in which he argued that 'Aryan' blood was concentrated in Britain, influenced Leese in anglicising the swastika through reference to the supposed "Sumer-Aryan linguistic roots of the Angled Cross' or 'Fylfot'", which he asserted meant "literally' a Foot in Fire, symbolic of the moving sun, itself the emblem of the old Aryan's God".

In 1934 the IFL published a leaflet entitled *The Swastika Symbol: What it Means* in which they stated that "the Angled Cross was a hieroglyph of 'Angle' from which 'English' is derived" and "was emblematic of Nordic fascist's determination 'to root out Jewish pestilence from our midst'".

Thus, began the reinterpretation of Norse Pagan iconography by the British far-right to suit a fascist and racially exclusive narrative.

# The British Union of Fascists 1932-1940

**Another early fascist party that made the transition from traditional fascist imagery to Norse iconography by using a stylised Rune.**

Using the corrupted version of the *Sōwilō* or *Sól* Rune known as *Sig* in the Armanian alphabet, Oswald Moseley created the ‘flash and circle’ logo that has since become synonymous with the iconography of fascism in the UK.

Derisively known as the ‘flash in a pan’ by his detractors, Moseley stated that “*The flash of action in the circle of union is the symbol of the British Union. National action can only come from that National union that ends the strife of Parties. Let Britons unit with the motto “Britain for the British”*”.

In adopting this symbol Moseley definitively aligned himself with the right-wing attributes assigned to the *Sig* pseudo-rune by Guido von List, an early proponent of Ariosophy and Wotanism, and the creator of the Armanian runic alphabet, which sought

to reinterpret the existing Futhork to better align with the emerging ideologies of German *Völkisch* ethnonationalism.

Von List applied the meaning of ‘victory’ to the rune, changing its name to *Sig* to reflect the German word for victory (*sieg*); the “𐌺” variant of the Elder Futhork *Sōwilō* Rune was adapted into the emblem of the Nazi *Schutzstaffel* by Walter Heck, and has become so synonymous with far-right ideology and neo-Nazism that many contemporary Germanic Pagans often wear the earlier Proto-Germanic “Σ” iteration of the Rune to avoid persecution.

Moseley continued to use this symbol for his Union Movement (1948-1973) and Action Party (1973-1974), however, the BUF still exists today - albeit as an online homage to Moseley, rather than as an active political party.

In 1973, John Yeowell - a member of the BUF - formed the first white supremacist ‘folkish’ Heathen group in the UK - the Odinic Rite.

# The British Movement 1957-present

**The British Movement is the term used for a group of far-right and fascist political parties and social movements from 1957 to present.**

The usage of the four-spoked Sunwheel symbol is synonymous with the British Movement, from the National Labour Party (NLP) in 1957 to the continued use by the contemporary iteration of the British National Socialist Movement today.

Whilst the Sun Wheel is not unique to the indigenous spiritual beliefs of Britain and is perhaps one of the most widely used symbols of ancient cultures across the world, in Britain it has been in use since neolithic prehistory and was used prevalently by the Germanic Pagan and Anglo-Saxon people of Britain.

It is for this reason that the British Movement appropriated the Sunwheel as their symbol of choice, along with corrupted version, the Broken Sun - essentially a circular swastika - used by the likes of Stromfront, *Englisc Andwig*, and Blood and Honour.

In 1960 the NLP and the White Defence League conglomaterated to form the *original* British National Party, who chose to retain the Sunwheel, this time in red, atop the Union Flag (as seen above).

The BNP constitution demanded “*the preservation of our Northern European folk – predominantly Nordic in race – and thereby the preservation of Northern European civilisation and the heritage of Britain*” stating that “*BNP membership is exclusively for those of purely Northern European racial ancestry*”.

This iteration of the Sun Wheel remained central to the branding for the National Socialist Movement, the British Movement, and the Greater Britain Movement (GBM) that later splintered from the British National Party, founder Jon Tyndall describing the emblem of the GBM as representing “*The fusion of the Nordic folkish heritage of our people with the modern British nation and the imperial role that destiny has allotted to her*”.



# The British National Party 1982-present

**The *current* British National Party (BNP) was founded by a conglomeration of the splinter groups from the *original* British National Party and the National Front (NF).**

Whilst the contemporary BNP now utilise the Union Flag as central to their iconography, the original iteration of their flag was an homage in both design and colour to the British Movement flag, with only the Sunwheel replaced by the initials of the party.

However, the continuing relationship between the right-wing ideology of the BNP and their association with racialised Paganism is evidenced by the likes of Nick Griffin, president of the BNP from 1999 to 2014, identifying himself as an ‘eco-Pagan’, and the youth branch of the BNP co-opting the *Othala* (or *Odal*) Rune as their symbol in 2002, ascribing to it the following statement:

*“The odal rune forms part of the futhark, the old alphabet of our ancestors.*

*As well as representing a distinct sound, runes also had symbolic and often magical qualities. To the Anglo-Saxons, the odal rune symbolised the beauty and preciousness of the Homeland.*

*The odal rune, in the colours of the Union Flag, was chosen to be the symbol of the YBNP, in order to show that whilst we are an entirely British organisation, we wish for solidarity with all other European nations who face exactly the same problems as we do.”*

The site also included what is described as an alleged ‘Anglo-Saxon rune poem’, written specifically to add a nativist element to the *Othala* Rune, explicitly including a reference to the *Völkisch* concept of ‘blood and soil’ and implying that the ‘native’ land of our forefathers is at risk of being lost, and with it our laws, customs, and freedoms.

# Right-Wing Movements 1980s-present

**The BNP, the English Defence League (EDL) and the now defunct British People's Party were the progenitors for contemporary right-wing movements that identify as having Pagan affiliations.**

In 1987, Blood and Honour (itself an offshoot from Combat 18, the paramilitary wing of the current BNP) was founded, utilising a combination of the Nazi *Totenkopf* and a stylised trinacrian *Triskele* as their symbols of choice.

The Racial Volunteer Force and the UK branch of Volksfront emerged as affiliate groups of Combat 18, and both were linked to the short-lived English Heathen Front.

Since this time, a number of extreme right-wing paramilitary and terrorist organisations have followed, many of whom affiliate themselves with the ideologies promulgated by those before them, resulting in an extreme right-wing interpretation of contemporary Germanic Paganism being truly embedded in the

ideologies of contemporary domestic terrorism in the UK.

National Action (NA) was founded in 2013, in response to the decline of the BNP and the EDL. NA used a symbol based on that of the Nazi *Sturmabteilung* which also served as the inspiration for Moseley's symbol of the BUF, utilising a representation of the Armanian *Sig* pseudo-rune.

The NA was proscribed as a terrorist organisation in 2016, making it the first far-right group to be proscribed in the UK since the BUF in the 1940's.

NA splinter groups include Scottish Dawn, System Resistance Network, and Scottish Nationalist Society; in addition members were involved in the creation of the now proscribed Sonnenkreig Division, the UK branch of the US neo-Nazi Atomwaffen Division.

More recently The Base, another neo-Nazi accelerationist paramilitary group, who utilise the pseudo-runic *Opfer* was proscribed in the UK.

# The Odinic Rite

The Odinic Rite was founded in the UK in 1973 by John Gibbs-Bailey and John Yeowell, who was a member of the British Union of Fascists.

The Odinic Rite's logo, consisting of three drops of blood to signify their doctrine of 'faith, folk and family' is a subtle acknowledgement of the *Völkisch* blood and soil mindset that Odinic Rite is very adept at hiding behind the more palatable concepts of family values, pride in ancestry, healthy (i.e., not interracial) relationships, and cultural history.

Although adept at portraying themselves as centrist on their website and public social media pages, they publish articles that are openly anti-LGBT (describing homosexuality as a form of medical dysfunction, a disease and as deviant behaviour in their article '*Odinic values in Family Life & Personal Relationships*', anti-miscegenation in their article '*Odinism, Youth & Morality*', and white supremacy in their article '*Community: A Lesson From Our Saxon Ancestors*').

# Woden's Folk

**Woden's Folk was formed in the UK in 1998 by an individual known as Wulf Ingesunnu.**

Woden's Folk are proponents of 'Wotanism' or 'Wodenism', promoting the theory that Hitler was a reincarnation of Odin.

Woden's Folk are an accelerationist group who believe that the final racial holy war of *Ragnarök* has begun and that the Woden's Folk will form the militia that protects the white race from corruption; they have previously hosted private rituals involving members of Combat 18 and other neo-Nazi groups.

Additionally, Woden's Folk espouse an openly accelerationist narrative, and typically anti-democratic views whilst also promoting the traditionalist family unit and roles of man + woman and children referring in no uncertain terms to the 14 words of David Lane, albeit it in more palatable terminology on their website.



**Multiracialism has produced a hell-on-earth in which crime, violence, perversion and subversion are rife. Multi-racialism or 'multi-culturalism' is the basis of a one-world state - a World Dictatorship."**

# The Odinist Fellowship

**The current Odinist Fellowship was created in the UK by Ralph Harrison in 1991, after his expulsion from the Odinic Rite.**

Harrison named the Odinist Fellowship after stating that he had sought permission from Else Christensen to do so in order to further her goals, a claim that is contested by the Odinic Rite and the Asatru Folk Assembly.

The Odinist Fellowship has been adept at raising their profile whilst seemingly promoting centrist views; in 2006 the Odinist Fellowship successfully supported an Odinist postal worker in an industrial tribunal following his dismissal, and using a charity number originally given to the Odinic Rite, the Odinist Fellowship purchased and established an Odinist Temple in Newark in 2014, intended to be the first of a network across Britain.

The Odinist Fellowship only allows white members, describing Odinism as ethno-specific, and stressing the need to maintain racial integrity.


# The British National Socialist Movement

Originally founded in 1968 by Colin Jordan and again in 1983 by Stephen Frost, the British National Socialist Movement is a neo-Nazi organisation that started as a political party, but is now a street protest and activist group.

The British Movement is an openly racist, ethnonationalist, anti-liberalist group that has an active flyposting campaign across the UK.

The group is very active on line, utilising its website and a number of far-right platforms such as Telegram, Gab, and 8Chan to promote racial discord, extensively utilising Pagan imagery to do so.

In addition to its frequent and repeated references to Stephen McNallen, Julius Evola, the 14 Words, and its anti-miscegenistic messaging, the site regularly promotes the Pagan calendar, posting *Völkisch* 'blood and soil' messages to their members on Yule, Ostara, Beltane, and other days of observation.

# Pagan 'militias'

*Pagan extremist groups that style themselves as militias, defending the country from immigration, miscegenation and fighting a 'racial holy war'.*



## WULFESHÉAFDA PÉODSCIBE

*Wulfeshéafda Péodscipe* describe themselves as a folkish group that stands for the troths of the Elder ways and Gods of the English founding peoples. They had their internet presence significantly reduced by various social media platforms after complaints about 'English holocaust' campaign.

## BRITONS PROUD ETHNIC FYRD

*Britons Proud Ethnic Fyrd* ('fyrd' being Old English for 'militia') are primarily an online group with a white supremacist and anti-Semitic agenda. Note the use of the Odinic Rite logo. The group recruits members to protect England from immigration, Christianity and Islam.



## ENGLISC ANDWIG

*Englisc Andwig* are a white supremacist neo-Nazi organisation allegedly founded in 2013, the group are a militant ethnonationalist, Eurosceptic, anti-Christian, and anti-Islamic protest organisation who also use far-right platforms such as Telegram, Gab, and 8Chan.

# The 'Brosatru' movement

*Pagan extremist groups that occupy the 'manosphere', perpetuating right-wing gender stereotypes and a toxic depiction of masculinity, with links to the Nazi 'werwolf' movement.*

## NORTHPACK

North Pack is an MMA and gym oriented group who promote an accelerationist narrative and train members at camps and events, providing the military and survivalist skills necessary for the imminent race war to lone actors and members of self-styled militias.

## NORSE FITNESS

Norse Fitness utilise a lot of contemporary Germanic Pagan imagery - especially the Valknut - to promote their misogynistic brand of Heathenry and their right-wing traditionalist quote 'Abandon Modern Culture'. Although founded in the US, Norse Fitness has a presence in the UK.



## SOLDIERS OF ODIN (UK)

Although founded in Finland, the Soldiers of Odin has chapters across the world, including the UK, and is linked to the Nordic Resistance Movement.

Established as a response to an increase in asylum seekers, the group claim they are protecting 'our women' against potential assailants.



# Pagan **terrorist** groups

*Pagan extremist groups that actively promote or have committed acts of terrorism, who claim to adhere to a Pagan ideology and utilise Pagan iconography.*




## NATIONAL ACTION

National Action was a right-wing extremist and neo-Nazi terrorist organisation that was founded by members of the National Front in 2013 after the decline of the British National Party and the English Defence League. The group was proscribed under the Terrorism Act 2000 in 2016, but rebranded a number of times.

## SCOTTISH DAWN

After National Action was proscribed many members went on to form Scottish Dawn in order to circumvent the ban.

Scottish Dawn, and NS131 (National Socialist Anti-Capitalist Action) - another iteration of National Action - were proscribed in 2017.



## SYSTEM RESISTANCE NETWORK

System Resistance Network arose in 2017 following the proscription of Scottish Dawn and NS131.

Members of this anti-LGBT and anti-refugee group went on to create the Sonnenkrieg Division after members were arrested for terrorism and hate crime offences.




## SCOTTISH NATIONALIST SOCIETY

The Scottish Nationalist Society arose in 2018. Its now deactivated website stated that the group support closed borders, strict immigration laws and the reintroduction of section 28, the legislation that banned the 'promotion' of homosexuality in schools.

## SONNENKREIG DIVISION


Sonnenkrieg Division is the UK branch of the neo-Nazi group Atomwaffen Division.

Numerous members have been convicted of terrorism offences, hate crimes, rape and child sex offences. The group was proscribed in 2020, but members have been arrested as recently as 2023.



## THE BASE

The Base was founded in the US in 2018 and has branches in several countries, including the UK. The Base is a neo-Nazi accelerationist paramilitary group which promotes white nationalism, and hosts 'hate camps' to train activist for the 'imminent race war'. The Base was proscribed in 2021.



# Right-wing **clothing** brands

*Companies and brands that cater specifically to members of the right-wing and extremist groups, often incorporating fascist imagery into their logos.*



## THOR STEINAR

This clothing brand uses a logo comprising of combined Sig and Tyr runes.

The company had to alter their logo after it was banned in several countries. The brand remains well connected to the far-right scene and is very popular among neo-Nazis.

## CONSDAPLE

This clothing brand is popular among racists and neo-Nazis as it contains the initials of the National Socialist Party of Germany (NSDAP).

Their older logo resembled the logo of the clothing brand LONSDALE, which explicitly objects to any far-right or racist ideology.



## MASTERRACE

An extremist clothing brand that primarily features known brand logos that are amended to convey a neo-Nazi message.

Examples include the ADIDAS logo amended to represent the Nazi salute over the word ADOLF, and The North Face logo adjusted to read as The North Race.





## HATE CRIME

A US-neo-Nazi clothing brand and music retailer based in the US. A hate crime is defined as “*a criminal offence committed against a person, property or society, which is motivated, fully or partly, by race, religion, disability, sexual orientation or ethnicity/national origin.*”

## WERWOLF

German neo-Nazi clothing brand that incorporates the Tyr rune into their logo.

This company openly offers neo-Nazi branded items for sale, as well as clothing for RWT bands such as Screwdriver and ZetaZeroAlfa.



## WALHALL

Walhall is the German spelling of Valhalla. Racists and neo-Nazis use this brand to show their hate for the Abrahamic religions.

Favoured by members of the Operation Werewolf RWT group.





## BELOYAR

A clothing brand used by various neo-Nazi networks mainly in Eastern Europe that features Nazi symbolism in their designs.

## SVASTONE

The Ukrainian neo-Nazi sportswear brand that employs variations of the swastika in its logos and produces clothes with far-right insignia for football fans.

It is distributed in the neo-Nazi networks mainly in Eastern Europe.



## WHITE REX

This Russian neo-Nazi sportswear brand reaches wider audience through supporting sporting events to promote far-right ideologies.

White Rex previously released a design comprising of an “88” print styled as falling bombs. Note the use of the Black Sun in their logo.



## OTADŽBINA

A Serbian clothing brand that employs neo-Nazi imagery and is distributed through various far-right networks and websites.

The brand is popular among some football fans in Serbia and Russia.

## WIKING WEAR

Clothing brand affiliated with international neo-Nazi network Misanthropic Division.



## MÍDGÅRD

An extremist clothing brand that caters directly to those attracted to the right wing proliferation of Norse and Pagan symbolism.

Their designs incorporate many right-wing messages including references to the racial holy war, blood and soil, and white supremacy.

# Extremist words, phrases and terminology

## RAHOWA

RaHoWa refers to the '*Racial Holy War*' that is promoted by accelerationists as the necessary means to reassert white dominance and prevent the destruction of the white race through miscegenation.

## 100%

Used by white supremacists in reference to having 'pure' white genetic or Aryan roots.

## ZOG

ZOG is an abbreviation of '*Zionist Occupational Government*', a conspiracy theory popular with right-wing ideologues which alleges that Jews control state power and the media.

## 18

Used by Combat 18 and other white supremacist groups to refer to the first and eighth letter of the alphabet - A & H

## 14

A reference to neo-Nazi David Lane's infamous '14 words' - a phrase actually comprised of two paragraphs, each containing 14 words, sometimes quoted together as well as separately: "*We must secure the existence of our people and a future for white children...*" "*...because the beauty of the White Aryan woman must not perish from the Earth*".

## 88

This numerical term can refer either to HH as an abbreviation of '*Heil Hitler*' or in reference to David Lane's '88 precepts', a racist, antisemitic and misogynistic treatise written by Lane whilst in prison for terrorism and other offences.

## 28

A reference to the Volkisch concept of '*Blood and Honour*', and the neo-Nazi group of the same name.

## MEINE EHRE HEISST TREUE

Translated as *'my honour is my loyalty'* this slogan was used by the Nazi SS during WWII and is very commonly translated into other languages and Runes by neo-Nazis, and used on banners and clothing.

## 2083

A reference to the title of Anders Breivik's manifesto, the *'European Declaration of Independence'*.

## 9%

This figure is sometimes quoted by ethnonationalists as the projected percentage of the world's white population by 2060.

## 6 WORDS

This term refers to the phrase *'Never date outside of your race'*.

## ORION

An acronym of *'Our race is our nation'*.

## FFF

The term *'Faith, Folk and Family'* refers to the Volkisch and ethnonationalist concept favoured by racially exclusive Germanic Pagans.

## WPWW

An acronym for *'white pride world wide'*.

## 6MWE

A particularly offensive acronym for the term *'6 million wasn't enough'* in reference to the estimated number of Jews killed by the Nazis during the Holocaust.

## OK

This term refers to the OK gesture, in which the hand forms a W and a P shape - used to convey the term *'white power'*.

## ANNUDA SHOAH


This term mocks the Yiddish accent and denigrates the Holocaust, *Shoah* being a Hebrew word for *'catastrophe'*.

## ROA

An acronym for *'race over all'* a term used by Volksfront and other white supremacist organisations.


## 23/16

This term represents the twenty-third and sixteenth letters of the alphabet, W and P, meaning *"white power"* or *"white pride"*





## THE SECRET ARYAN WAY

Written by Geoffrey Dunn, otherwise known as ‘Wulf Ingessunu’ of Woden’s Folk.

This is one of several self-aggrandising works that seeks to depict Dunn as a ‘Heathen Mystic’. This publication is a typically confused conglomeration of Heathenry, conspiracy theory and fantasy presented as a contemporary iteration of Heathenry.



## The British Edda

## THE BRITISH EDDA

Written by Laurence Waddell this is a confused work that conflates Norse deities, Arthurian legend and the Christian concept of Eden, and in which Waddell argues that the Poetic Edda was written in a language that originated from Scotland, thus evidencing that the Aryo-Nordic race in fact hailed from Britain...





## THE SECRET OF THE RUNES

Written by Guido von List, an Austrian occultist and elucidator of early Wotanism.

Through this work von List sought to reinterpret the Runes through an ariosophical lens in order to accomodate the emerging *Volkisch* movement that inspired the racially exclusive perspective of the NSDAP.

## DER WEHRWOLF

A fictional account of the 30 years' war in which a peasant protagonist defends his village from pillagers. Favoured by Hitler, this book became mandatory reading for the Nazi child soldiers known as *Luftwaffenhelfers*, and those who, towards the end of the war, took part in disruptive 'werewolf tactics' behind enemy lines.



## THUS SPOKE ZARATHUSTRA


Written by German philosopher Friedrich Nietzsche, this book introduced the '*Übermensch*', a concept that became the primary driver behind the eugenicist vision of a genetically superior Aryan race, aspired to by the Nazi '*Lebensborn*' project.

## SIEGE


A collection of stories compiled into a single book that document the means to initiate a white revolution through terrorism and 'siege culture'.

James Mason is a neo-Nazi and an associate of Charles Manson who wrote for the National Socialist Liberation Front and has been proscribed in Canada as a promoter of terrorism.

## THE PROTOCOLS OF ZION

Also known by its full title of 'The Protocols of the Learned Elders of Zion' this publication has long been proven to be a hoax, created circa 1900 to perpetuate the conspiracy that 'international Jewry' maintains control of the state and the media to attain world domination.

## MEIN KAMPF

Written by Hitler during his imprisonment for the failed Munich Putsch, this rambling egoistical book describes his political ideology, his political aspirations, and the foundations of his antisemitism.

# Skrewdriver

## SKREWDRIVER

A white power skinhead band originally founded in 1976. Skrewdriver were a major driving force behind the Rock Against Communism movement, a series of concerts that promoted various white supremacist bands.

Although the band split in 1993 they are seen as the progenitors of white power punk music.

## ZETAZEROALFA

ZetZeroAlfa are the official band of the Italian neo-fascist political movement CasaPound who encourage their fanbase to partake in acts of racial motivated acts of violence.

The Guardian newspaper refers to the band as “an evangelising force for fascism”.



## AGGRESSIVE FORCE

A hardcore punk band that promotes violent white supremacy through the use of Germanic Pagan imagery.




## BATTLEFIELD

A white power rock band that combines racially exclusive lyrics with Viking imagery - not to be confused with the Scottish folk band *The Battlefield Band*.

## KOLOVRAT

A Russian neo-Nazi thrash metal band that was invited to play at the state sanctioned Russian march in Bolotnaya Square in 2009. *Kolovrat* is an eight-spoked swastika used by members of the resurgent nativist Slavic neo-Paganism movement *Rodnovery*.



## RAHOWA

Formed by George Burdi, a Canadian white power musician who also identifies as a mysticist. Burdi also founded Resistance Records and a magazine called *Resistance* to promote white nationalist musicians and bands.

# BURZUM

## BURZUM

Considered to be the first of the National Socialist Black Metal bands, this Norwegian band was led by Varg Vikernes, who was subsequently imprisoned for murder and the arson of several churches.

Burzum frequently used Norse mythology and references to Tolkien in their lyrics.

## XENOCIDE

With albums entitled '*United Aryans in antisemitic terror*' and '*Cleansing and destruction of modernity for a better world*' Xenocide openly promote their xenophobic, militant antisemitism.

The band utilises Pagan and pseudo-Pagan iconography, such as the Black Sun or *Sonnenrad* in their artwork.



## PAGANBLUT

A Bulgarian National Socialist Black Metal band which openly praises the NSDAP - especially the Nazi SS and the *Deutsche Afrikakorps*, and extensively utilises Germanic Pagan imagery in their artwork.
